What is a social enterprise?

Social enterprises are businesses whose core objective is to achieve a social, societal or environmental impact. See a simple 5-step test below to determine if an organisation is a social enterprise:

The P.A.S.T.A. Test



Purpose

Its objective is to achieve a social, societal or environmental impact, rather than maximising profit for its owners or shareholders.



Asset Lock

If dissolved, its assets go to a similar organisation rather than to the owners or shareholders.



Surplus

It reinvests surpluses into achieving social objectives.



Trading

It pursues its objectives by trading on an ongoing basis through the provision of goods and/or services.



Accountability

It is governed in a fully accountable and transparent manner.

How do I setup a social enterprise?

A social enterprise can be set up in a variety of ways depending on how you'd like to structure the business. Below are some basic guidelines.

First steps to set up



Identify your social purpose

Decide the social, societal or environmental impact issue you wish to address.



Choose a legal structure

Social enterprises can be one of several legal structures, incl. a CLG, co-operative, Company Limited by Shares, and unincorporated association.



Develop a business plan

To look for funding and other supports, it's useful to write a business plan which describes how to plan to develop your social enterprises.

How are social enterprises funded?

Social enterprises generate funding from a variety of sources. Below are the most common sources of income and some other sources for added context.

Most common sources



Selling goods/services

70% of social enterprises in Ireland generate income from selling products and services.



Government grants

75% of social enterprises in Ireland generate income from government grants.



Fundraising from public/members

39% of social enterprises in Ireland generate income from fundraising with the general public or their members.

Other sources

Other sources include service contracts, membership fees, philanthropy, fees and CSR.

What do social enterprises do?

Social enterprises operate in every sector of the economy. Below are the most common types of social enterprises as well as some other typical types of social enterprise.

Most common types



Childcare

1,156 social enterprises in Ireland (or 26.7% of the sector) operate in the childcare space.



Community Infrastructure

711 social enterprises in Ireland (or 16.4% of the sector) operate in community infrastructure and local development.



Health, Youth & Social Care

592 social enterprises in Ireland (or 13.7% of the sector) operate in the health, youth services and social care space.

Other types

Other types include festivals, sports and leisure facilities, training and work integration, environmental services, housing and consulting.

What is the National Social Enterprise Policy for Ireland?

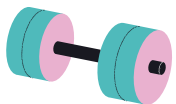
The policy is the first ever national policy for social enterprise in Ireland. Its purpose is to enable social enterprise to grow in scale, support jobs, and make a positive impact on individuals and communities.

Summary



Building Awareness of SEs

Developing and promoting an understanding of social enterprise is a key part of the implementation of this Policy.



Growing and Strengthening SEs

An objective of the policy is to improve the range, quality and consistency of supports available to social enterprises throughout the country.



Achieving Better Policy Alignment

The policy seeks to ensure that the various government policies and supports for social enterprises are aligned.

What's the difference between a social enterprise and a community group?

The differences between a social enterprise and community group can be obvious or quite subtle but the key difference is that one entity trades and the other does not.

Key difference



Trading

A social enterprise pursues its objectives by trading on an ongoing basis through the provision of goods and/or services.

A community group pursues its objectives without trading. It usually generates income through grants, fundraising, philanthropy and CSR.

There are ongoing debates at a national and international level about how much income should come from trading for an organisation to be defined as a social enterprise.
